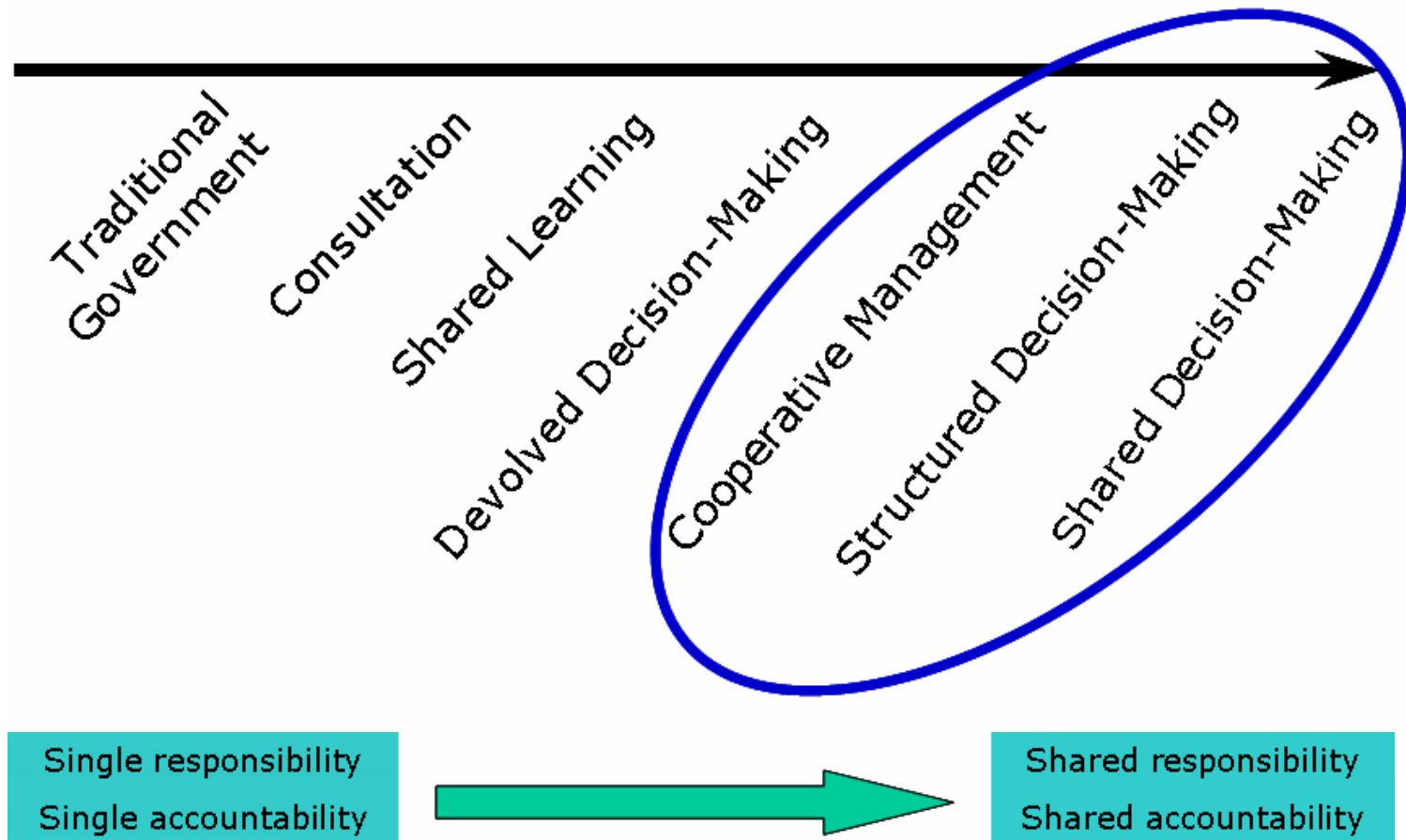

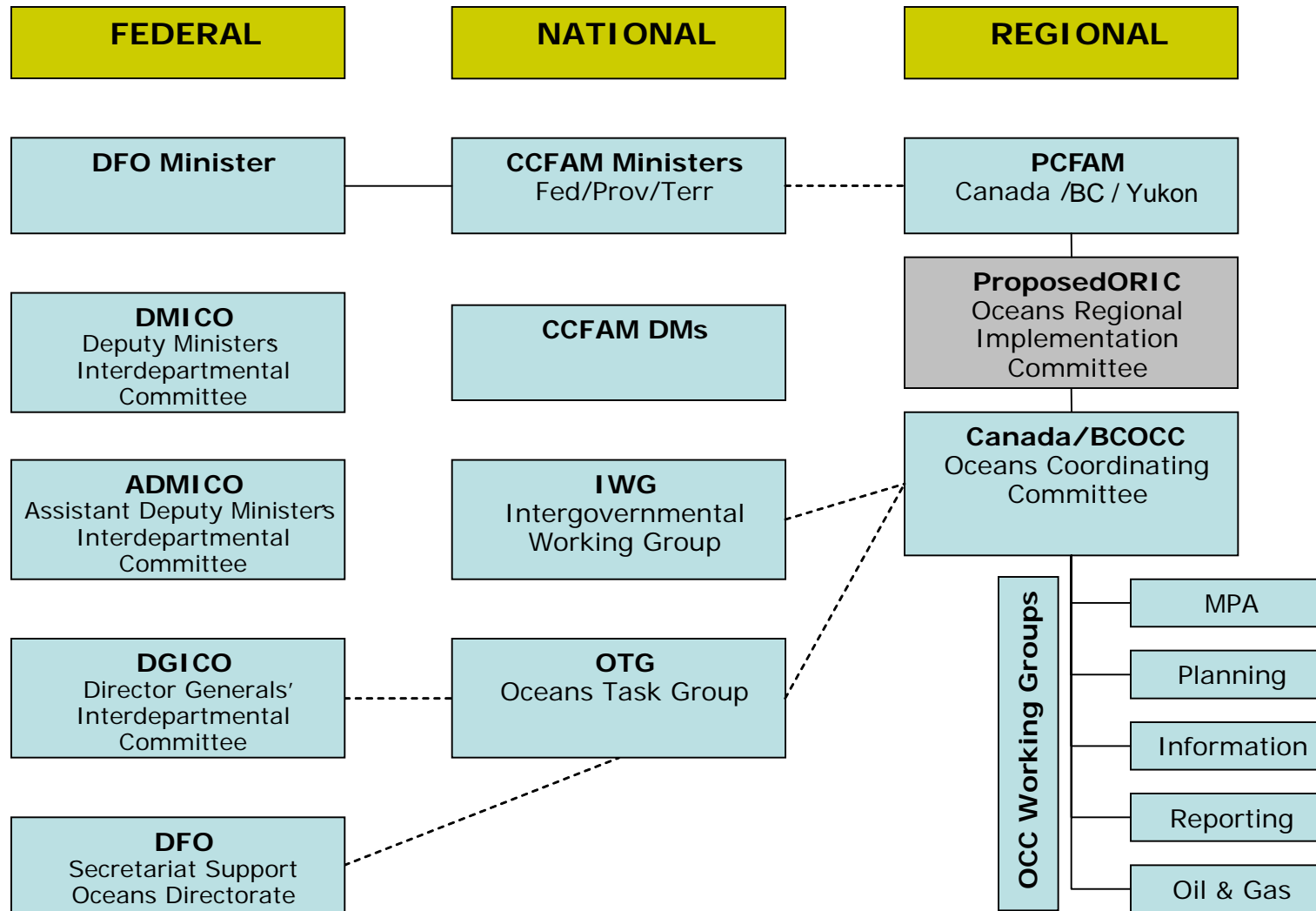

### Continuum of Governance Arrangements



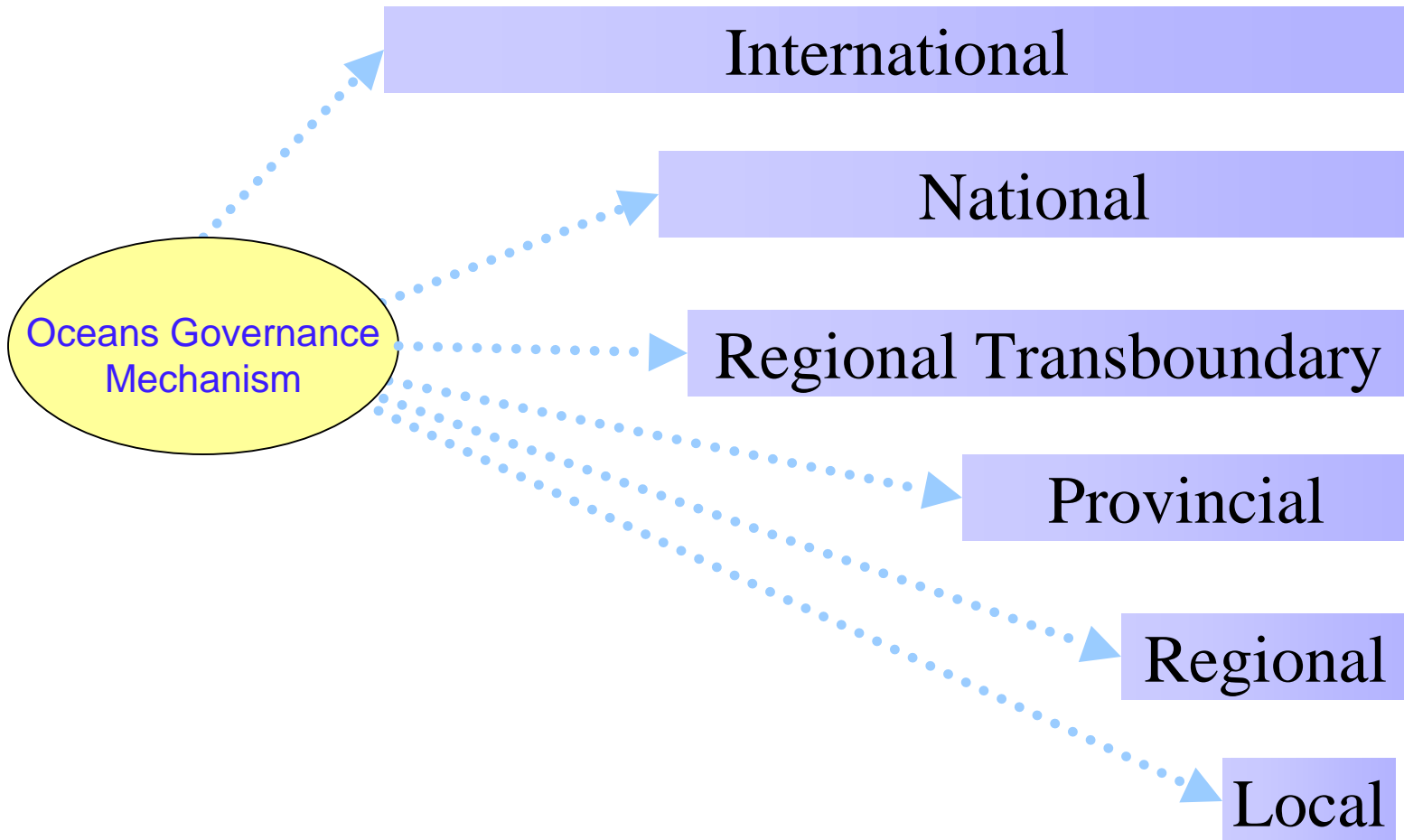
## Oceans Governance Relationships



# Spatial Scales of Governance

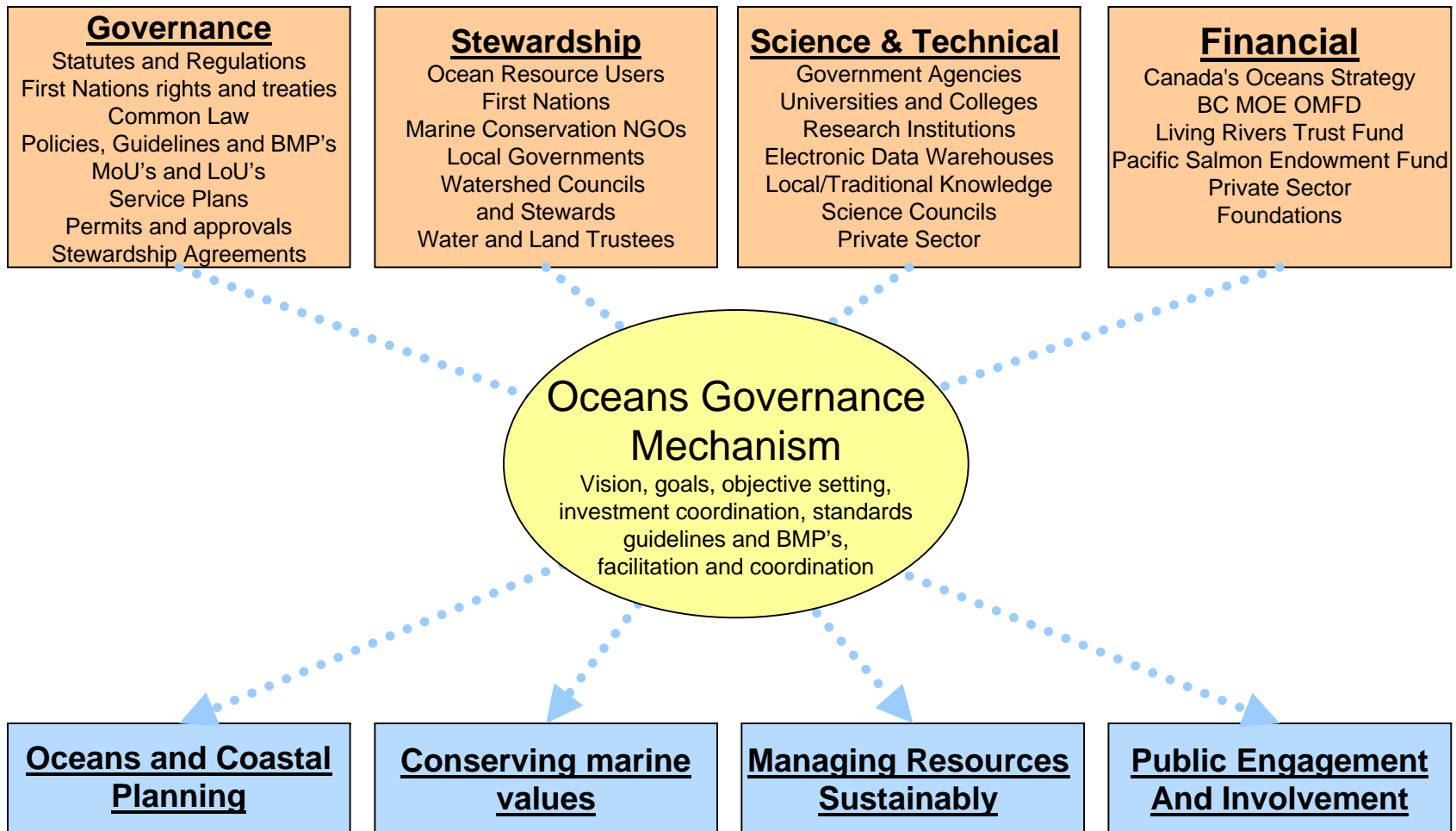

# A Proposed Oceans Governance Model

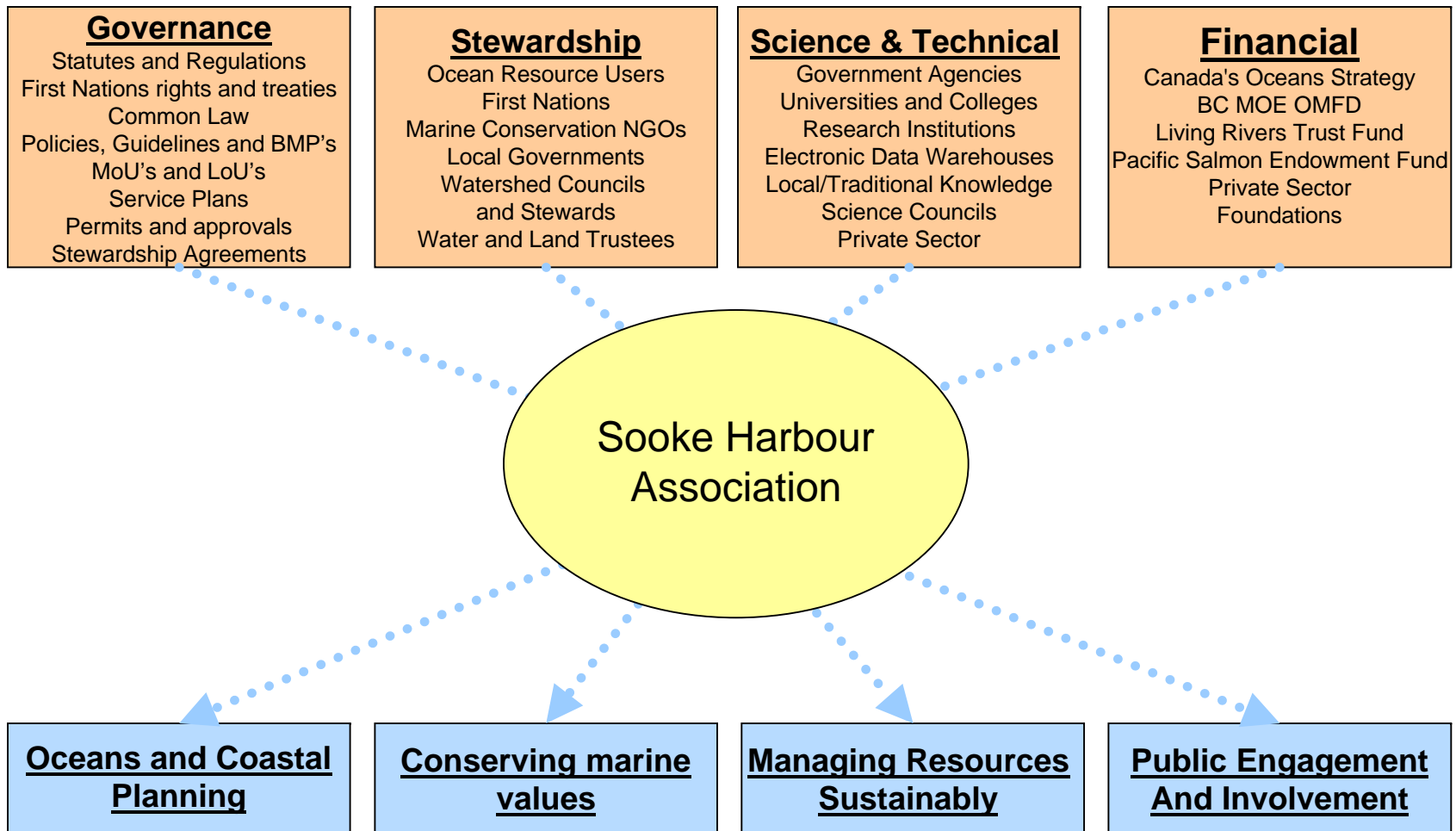
**Capacities:** the collective energies of the public, private and voluntary sectors

# Local Oceans Governance Model

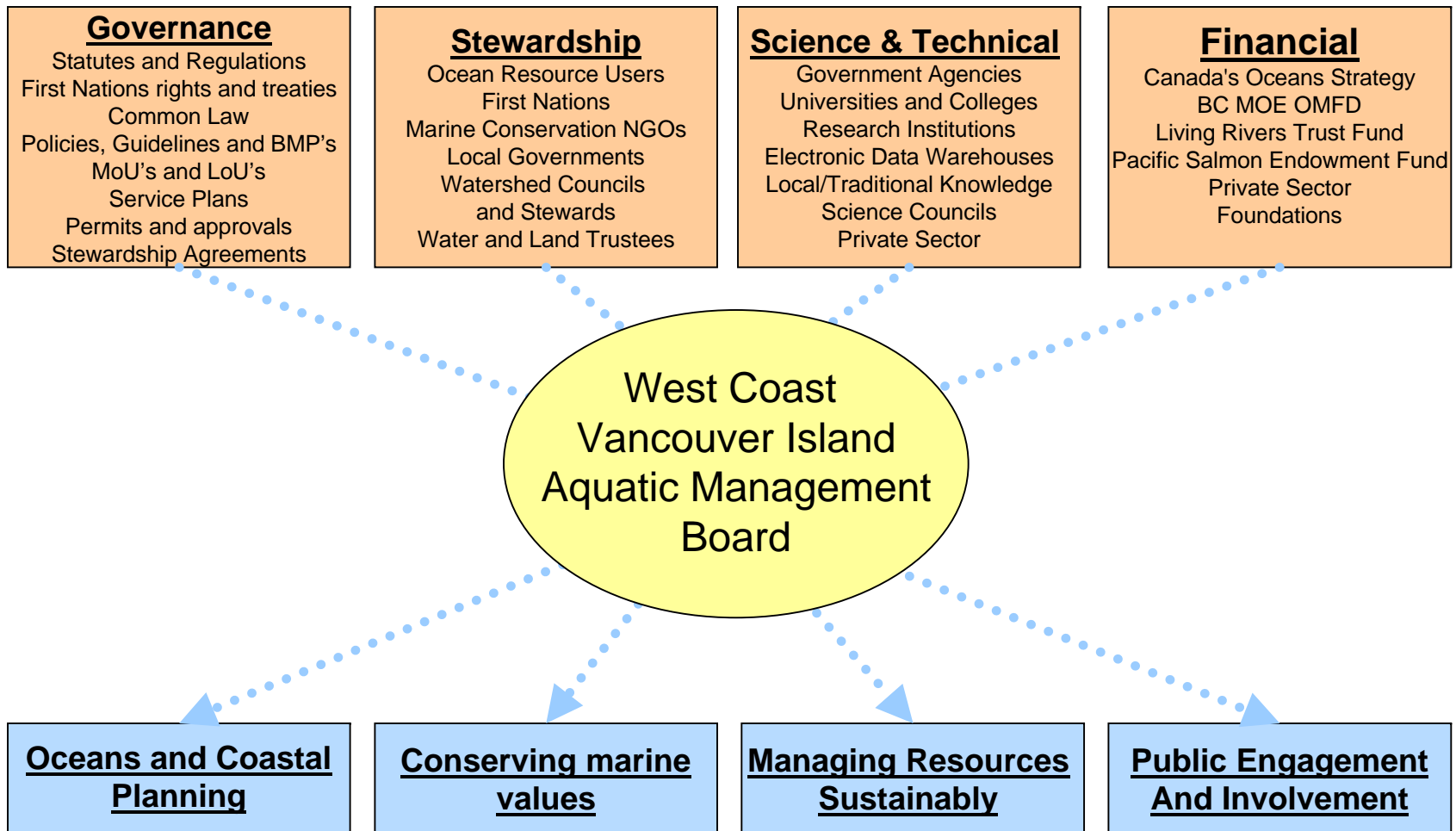

# Regional Oceans Governance Model

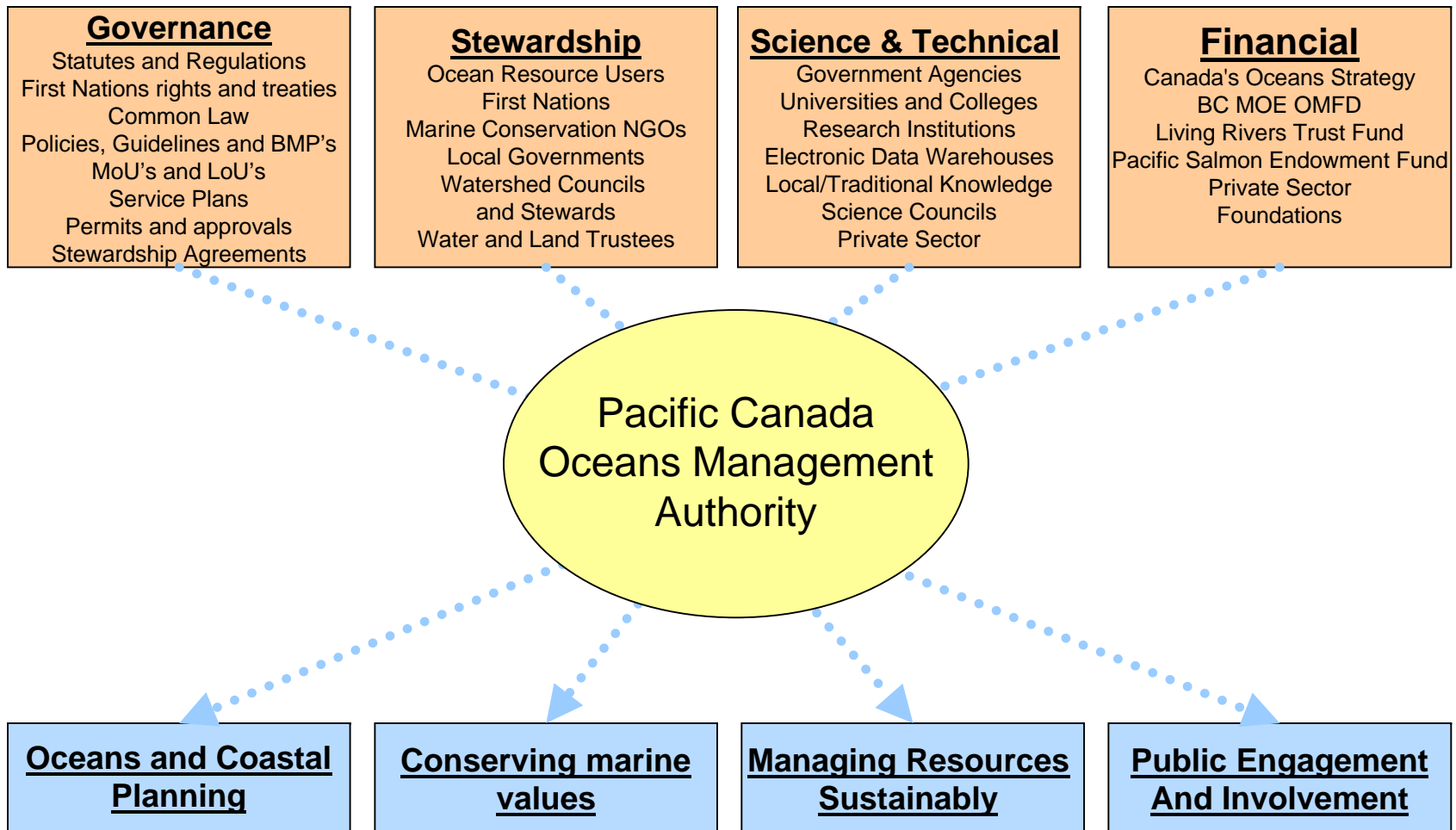

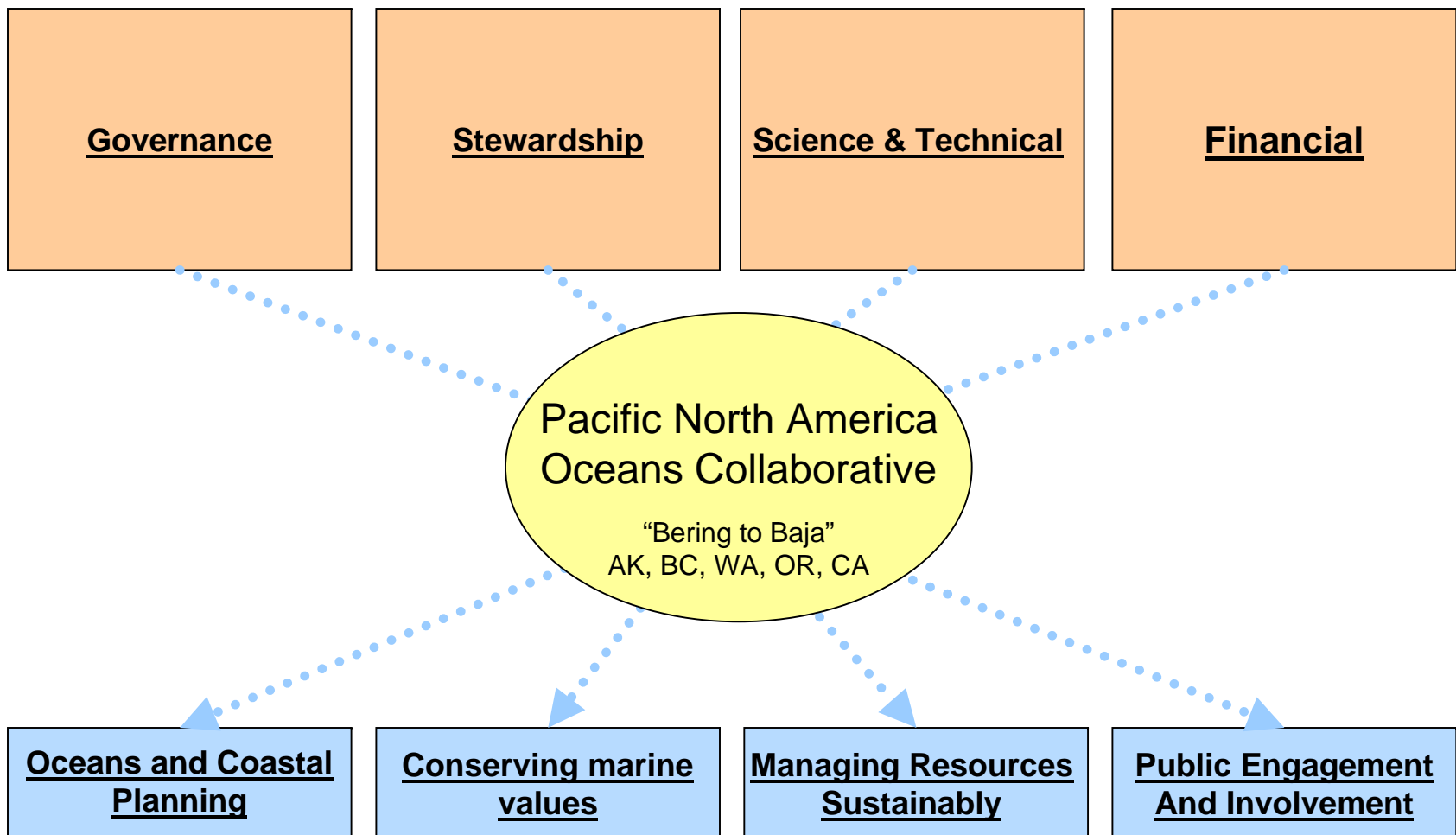

# Regional Transboundary Oceans Governance Model

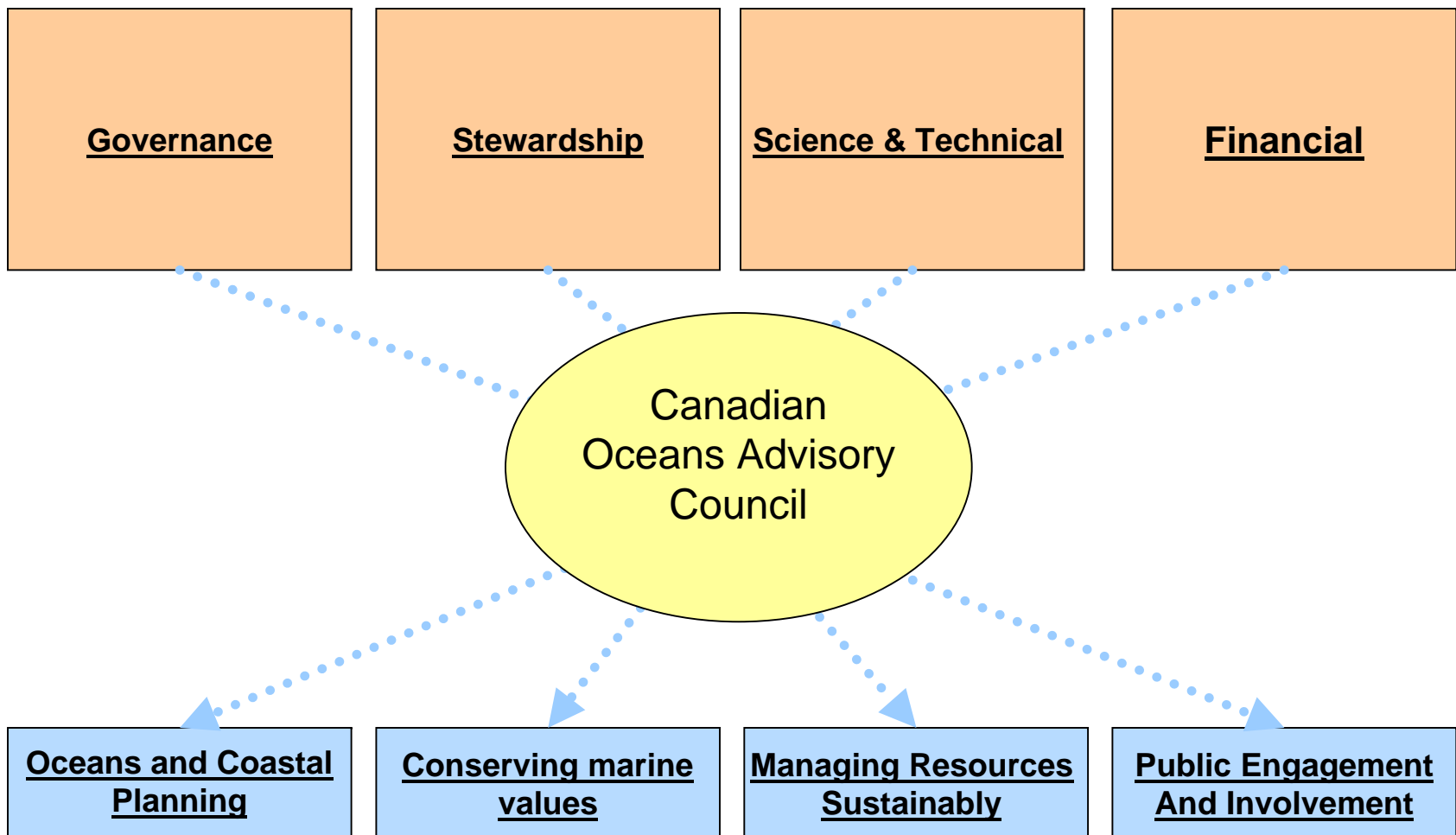
